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1. Design Philosophy

The site shall embody the Nation’s Mesoamerican lineage through natural textures and ceremonial color harmonies. Each visual layer must evoke **ancestral continuity, ecological balance, and sovereign dignity**.

4. Texture Application Guidelines

- Opacity:**
10–20% for background textures; 40–60% for decorative borders.
- Layering:**
Stone texture forms the structural base; feather gradients overlay interactive zones; mosaic patterns frame ceremonial sections.
- Contrast:**
Maintain readability; avoid heavy saturation behind text.
- Responsiveness:**
Textures must scale fluidly across devices without distortion.

6. Ceremonial Wheel Integration

- Place the **Wakále Amotí wheel** at the top of its page as the central mandala.
- Each spoke links to its module section.
- Surround with feather gradient halo and mosaic border for balance.
- Add short ceremonial taglines beneath each module icon.

- All visual elements must reflect the standardized national name **KWAJI:YÄ KNÖGÉ**.
