

NAGA-KHAN CONFEDERATION OF AMARUCA (NCA) – Revised Charter

Preamble

We, the Tribal Chiefs and representatives of Indigenous peoples from diverse tribal communities of Turtle Island, assemble to establish the **NAGA-KHAN CONFEDERATION OF AMARUCA (NCA)**.

Acknowledging our sacred duty to preserve the rights, cultures, traditions, and lands of our people, we affirm:

1. Our sovereignty as Indigenous Nations.
2. The establishment of a **Sovereign Tribunal**, the ultimate authority for dispute resolution, treaty interpretation, and upholding tribal law.
3. Our commitment to peace, friendship, and cooperation among all peoples, including formal engagement with the United Nations and its member states.
4. The responsibility to act collectively for the prosperity, survival, and spiritual-cultural continuity of our posterity.

Article I – Purpose and Objectives

The NCA shall:

1. Promote peace, friendship, and understanding among Indigenous peoples and the global community.
2. Advance the rights, sovereignty, and self-determination of Indigenous peoples.
3. Protect and preserve cultural heritage, ancestral lands, and natural resources.
4. Serve as a platform for dialogue, consultation, and collaboration among member tribes, communities, and nations.
5. Enhance Indigenous representation in global governance forums.
6. Empower communities through education, cultural revival, and sustainable development initiatives.

Article II – Membership

1. Membership is open to all Indigenous tribes, communities, and nations recognized by their respective states and committed to the principles of this Confederation.
2. Prospective members shall apply through a designated process, outlining their commitment to peace, friendship, and cultural preservation.
3. Admission decisions shall be made by consensus of existing members, ensuring diverse representation of cultures and regions.
4. All members acknowledge the authority of the **Sovereign Tribunal** and agree to abide by its rulings.

Article III – Organization and Structure

1. **General Assembly**
 - Supreme governing body, convening regularly to set the Confederation's agenda, make collective decisions, and discuss matters of importance.
2. **Executive Council**
 - Responsible for day-to-day operations and implementation of decisions.
 - Composed of elected representatives from member tribes.
 - Represents the NCA externally and coordinates with global partners.
3. **Sovereign Tribunal** (*New Addition*)
 - Serves as the highest judicial and interpretive authority within the NCA.
 - Jurisdiction includes:
 - Dispute resolution between members or tribes.
 - Interpretation of treaties, agreements, and customary law.
 - Oversight of governance and ceremonial compliance.
 - Tribunal members are appointed by consensus of the General Assembly, representing the wisdom, experience, and traditions of the member tribes.
 - Tribunal rulings are **binding** on all members and recognized as the ultimate authority of the Confederation.
4. **Standing Committees**
 - Focus on land rights, cultural preservation, environmental sustainability, education, and health.

- Membership open to representatives from all member tribes.
- Collaborate with relevant United Nations bodies and other external partners.

Article IV – Cooperation with the United Nations

1. The NCA seeks formal relationships with the United Nations based on mutual respect, partnership, and cooperation.
2. Engage with UN bodies such as the Permanent Forum on Indigenous Issues and the Human Rights Council.
3. Advocate for Indigenous rights, contribute expertise, and promote Indigenous perspectives in global discussions.
4. Ensure all agreements with external bodies uphold the authority of the **Sovereign Tribunal**.

Article V – Dispute Resolution

1. Disputes between member tribes or within the Confederation shall be first addressed through dialogue, mediation, and consensus.
2. If unresolved, disputes shall be escalated to the **Sovereign Tribunal**, whose rulings are final and binding.
3. Tribunal decisions will be enforced by the Executive Council and respected by all members.

Article VI – Confidentiality and Treaty Protocol

1. Parties to agreements or treaties shall respect proprietary and confidential information disclosed by another party.
2. Confidential information remains the property of the disclosing party.
3. The Sovereign Tribunal serves as the arbiter in disputes regarding breaches of confidentiality or treaty obligations.
4. Confidentiality obligations survive termination of agreements or treaties.

Article VII – Rights, Services, and Community Development

1. The NCA shall support members' access to education, cultural resources, trade networks, and economic development programs.
2. Initiatives shall focus on health, prosperity, security, and sustainability of member communities.

3. All programs shall respect ancestral practices, Indigenous knowledge systems, and communal decision-making.

Conclusion

Through this Confederation, Indigenous peoples represented by the NCA assert:

1. Their sovereignty and the authority of the **Sovereign Tribunal**.
2. Their commitment to cultural preservation, community development, and peaceful cooperation with the global community.
3. Their dedication to ensuring future generations inherit the full benefit of ancestral lands, knowledge, and rights.
